Tech Tip: Free Phones to Help You Stay Connected

FREE Specialized Phones Help You

Communicate Better

If it is getting a bit harder for you or someone you know to use your home or mobile phone, you should know the State of California offers *free* phones to make it easier for you to stay connected. Over half a million Californians use these specialized phones from the California Public Utilities Commission's Deaf & Disabled Telecommunications Program which is supported by a small surcharge included on all California telephone bills.

These specialized phones support difficulties with hearing, speech, mobility, vision or memory. Their unique features - including amplification, photo or bigger buttons,





flashing lights or talking keypads, headsets and neck loops, visual displays of spoken words, speakerphone, programmable memorydialing and various accessories - give you the extra support you may need to stay engaged in the conversation. Most phones are hearing-aid com-

patible and there are no additional service costs beyond your regular telephone service.

California residents with telephone service and a doctor who will approve the need are eligible. To apply, there is a simple, 3-step process - 1) fill out the application form from their website, 2) have your doctor sign the application, 3) you mail or fax the form. Once approved, you call California Phones to discuss which phone is best for you.
